

KOSCIUSKO LITERACY SERVICES BY THE POSITIVE IMPACTS IN 2014

From 2009 to 2014, the 12 to 15% percent improvement of the Free and Reduced Lunch Program children passing the third grade Language Arts portion of ISTEP shows a 96.3% correlation rate to the percentage of children who were enrolled in Read to Grow Children's Book Club.

In collaboration with Warsaw Adult Education and WorkOne, 92 adults earned an Indiana High School Equivalency Diploma and 16 completed the requirements for a Workplace Certification.

299 adults enrolled at Warsaw Adult Education improved their education level.

At the Kosciusko County Jail, 5 inmates earned an Indiana High School Equivalency Diploma.

775 children from low-income homes received monthly book selections in Read to Grow Children's Book Club .

Read to Grow Children's Book Club parents read a combined 12,100 hours.

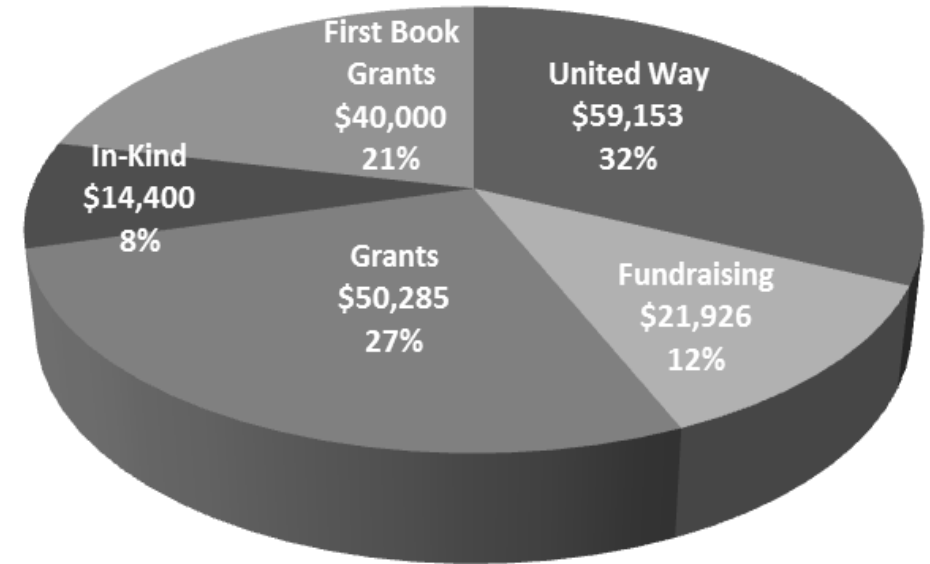

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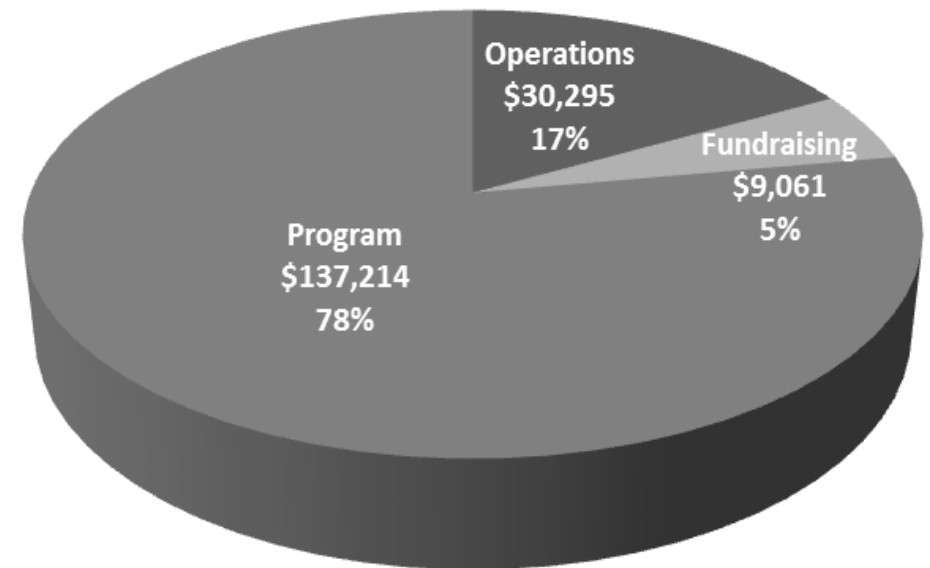

Read to Grow Children's Book Club

Reading is a lifelong habit she is instilling in her children. Currently, over 550 children each receive a new book monthly.

One-on-One Tutoring for Adults

The One-on-One Tutoring for Adults program offers adults the opportunity to work with a tutor to achieve their goals by improving their skills. Volunteers tutor adult students who are learning to read, earning a high school equivalency diploma, or learning English as a second language.
