THE NEED FOR LITERACY

Kosciusko County, Indiana, has a population over 78,560. Hispanics comprise approximately 8% of the population.

Kosciusko County has an estimated 9% adult illiteracy rate. This percentage translates to 5,500 people over age 16 needing improvement in basic prose literacy.

Nearly 15% of the adult population does not have a high school diploma or equivalency diploma.

The poverty rate in 2014 was 12.0%, and the poverty rate for children under eighteen was 16.7%. The median household income in 2014 was \$ 54,068. Single parent households numbered 2,151. In 2014, Food Stamp recipients totaled 6,751.

The Free and Reduced Lunch Recipients numbered 6,531. A school enrollment of 13,816 indicates that 47% of students were on the Free and Reduced Lunch Program.

In 2014, Kosciusko County had an unemployment rate of 4.9%. This percentage has improved in recent years. In 2010, the unemployment rate in Kosciusko County was 10.3%, a sharp increase over the 2007 rate of 4.2%. Kosciusko County has many residents employed directly or indirectly by the Recreational Vehicle Industry, which was negatively impacted by the downturn in the economy. The RV industry is rebounding, but remains vulnerable to economic trends.

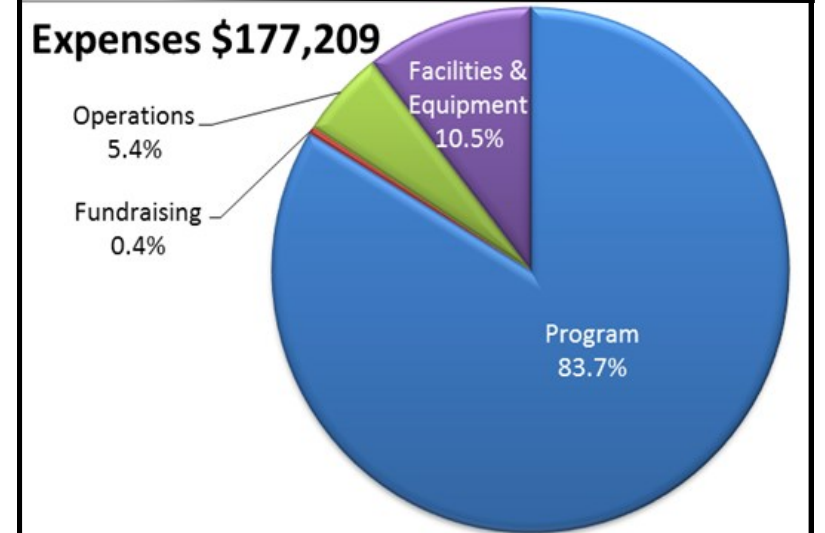
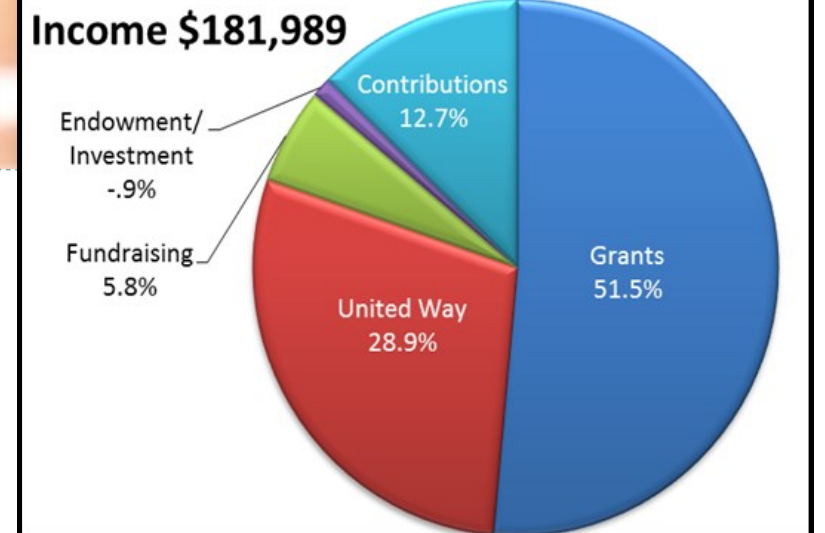

HIGHLIGHTS

From 2009 to 2014, the 12 to 15% percent improvement of the Free and Reduced Lunch Program children passing the third grade Language Arts portion of ISTEP shows a 96.3% correlation rate to the percentage of children who were enrolled in Read to Grow Children's Book Club.

In 2015, the ISTEP changed, the passing rate of third grade children on the Free and Reduced Lunch Program in Kosciusko County was 7.8% higher than that of the State, while the Paid Lunch rate was only .1% higher than that of the state.

In collaboration with Warsaw Adult Education and WorkOne, 59 adults earned an Indiana High School Equivalency Diploma and 3 completed the requirements for a Workplace Certification.

250 adults enrolled at Warsaw Adult Education improved their education level.

978 children from low-income homes received monthly book selections in Read to Grow Children's Book Club .

Read to Grow Children's Book Club parents read a combined 15,962 hours to their children.
